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The Just Shall Live by Faith: David and Goliath

When it comes to doing the work of God, we have to overcome the tendency to be intimidated by evil.

Of all the things that the devil does (and does well) it is undoubtedly his ability to intimidate, to make us seem small, to make victory over evil an impossible dream. I can remember as a kid looking at the Disney *Sleeping Beauty* film, and the little prince fighting the huge black dragon, who blew out of his mouth and nostrils streams of deadly fire and destruction. The prince looked so little, so vulnerable. I doubted seriously if he could muster the will and strength to defeat such an awesome foe.

Correspondingly, when we look at the harvest of the world's inner-city lost, we can, too be easily overwhelmed. The numbers of lost individuals and families is vast, literally millions of neighborhoods without any light of the Savior present, in neighborhoods riddled with despair, violence, poverty, neglect, and doubt. If we look at the urban poor through the natural eye, we can easily give up, be completely overwhelmed, even frozen with fear and intimidation. How can we, you, our church, our ministry, our missions effort, our street ministry, our TUMI satellite possibly affect a community a thousand times larger than anything we could cover in a decade?

Be honest with yourself. How can we, so little, frail, and, at least at first sight, so vulnerable, possibly be used to win a neighborhood, convert an entire gang, clean up a project, bring revival to a community, or see an entire city, even a nation won to Christ? Aren't we kidding ourselves? Should we simply, as someone once commented to me, "get real" and set goals more in sync with our resources, our abilities, our opportunities?

If God were going to use a hero, find an apostle, raise up a prophet, a preacher, or an army, aren't we the least likely folk to pull that off?



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Shouldn't we try to be realistic and simply seek goals more in keeping with our ability and strengths and person?

Let me repeat: Of all the things that the devil does (and does well) it is undoubtedly his ability to intimidate, to make us seem small, to make victory over evil an impossible dream.

Our thesis for the upcoming Let God Arise! season is this: in spite of those people, things, and situations that call our motives, competencies, and usefulness into question, we can still win the battle because we belong to and represent the Lord God.

Of all the stories in Scripture where this principle is boldly portrayed, the confrontation between David, youngest son of Jesse, and Goliath, the champion of the Philistines, represents the best.

You remember the story. It begins with the challenge Goliath, God's defiant enemy, gave to the people of Israel. The Philistines gathered their armies for battle at Socoh, which belonged to Judah. Saul and the men of Israel were gathered, and encamped in the Valley of Elah, and drew up in line of battle against the Philistines.

Goliath was an intimidating figure. A champion of Gath, whose height was six cubits and a span, or as some say, close to nine feet tall. He had a helmet of bronze on his head, he was armed with a coat of mail, and the weight of the coat was five thousand shekels of bronze. He had bronze armor on his legs and a javelin of bronze slung between his shoulders. The shaft of his spear was like a weaver's beam, his spear's head weighed six hundred shekels of iron, and his shield-bearer went before him.

Standing before Saul and his troops, Goliath shouted to the ranks of Israel, "Why have you come out to draw up for battle? Am I not a Philistine, and



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are you not servants of Saul? Choose a man for yourselves, and let him come down to me. If he is able to fight with me and kill me, then we will be your servants. But if I prevail against him and kill him, then you shall be our servants and serve us. I defy the ranks of Israel this day. Give me a man, that we may fight together."

The Bible says that when Saul and all Israel heard these words, they were "dismayed and greatly afraid." For forty days the Philistine came forward and took his stand, morning and evening. Twice a day, for forty days, the Philistine thundered his threats and intimidation against Saul and his army, and no one came forward to challenge him or defy his blasphemies.

Over against this imposing figure enters little David, the son of Jesse, an Ephrathite of Bethlehem in Judah, who had eight sons. David's three oldest brothers had followed Saul to the battle, and David was the youngest, who fed his father's sheep at Bethlehem.

Jesse gave David some parched grain, ten loaves and ten cheeses for the commander of his brothers, "to see if your brothers are well, and bring some token from them."

The Scriptures say that David rose early in the morning and left the sheep with a keeper and took the provisions and went, as Jesse had commanded him. And he came to the encampment as the host was going out to the battle line, shouting the war cry. Israel and the Philistines drew up for battle, army against army.

Once David arrived, he left the things in charge of the keeper of the baggage, ran to the ranks, and greeted his brothers. As he talked with them, behold, the champion, the Philistine of Gath, Goliath by name, came up out of the ranks of the Philistines and spoke the same words as before. And David heard him.



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All the men of Israel, when they saw the man, fled from him and were much afraid. And the men of Israel said, "Have you seen this man who has come up? Surely he has come up to defy Israel. And the king will enrich the man who kills him with great riches and will give him his daughter and make his father's house free in Israel." And David said to the men who stood by him, "What shall be done for the man who kills this Philistine and takes away the reproach from Israel? For who is this uncircumcised Philistine, that he should defy the armies of the living God?"

This is where we see vividly the work of Satan through lying intimidation, and its sickening enchantments on all of Israel. For instance, David's inquiry about what will happen to the person who defeats Goliath is met with skepticism and anger by his oldest brother Eliab, who said to him "Why have you come down? And with whom have you left those few sheep in the wilderness? I know your presumption and the evil of your heart, for you have come down to see the battle."

Even when David volunteered to fight, Saul and his generals said he was too young, too inexperienced, unfit to take on a challenge as formidable and awesome as Goliath. But David answered Saul, with stories of his valor when a lion, or a bear, came and took a lamb from the flock, that he went after him and struck him and delivered it out of his mouth. David assured Saul that even when a wild predator arose against him, that he caught him by his beard and struck him and killed him.

In the logic of a bold young warrior, David then told Saul that "Your servant has struck down both lions and bears, and this uncircumcised Philistine shall be like one of them, for he has defied the armies of the living God." He comforted Saul and said, "The Lord who delivered me from the paw of the lion and from the paw of the bear will deliver me from the hand of this Philistine."



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Saul agreed at David's lack of intimidation saying, "Go, and the Lord be with you!" and even offered David his own personal armor, putting a helmet of bronze on his head and clothing him with a coat of mail. David strapped Saul's sword over his armor, and he refused them since he hadn't tested them. He put them off and rather took his staff in his hand and chose five smooth stones from the brook and put them in his shepherd's pouch.

David had his sling in his hand when he approached the Philistine. Goliath moved forward and came near to David, with his shield-bearer in front of him. And when Goliath looked and saw David, he held him in contempt, he disdained him, because David was "a youth, ruddy and handsome in appearance." He taunted David saying, "Am I a dog, that you come to me with sticks?" Goliath cursed David by his gods, and then said to David, "Come to me, and I will give your flesh to the birds of the air and to the beasts of the field."

In the face of his oldest brother's rejection, Saul and his generals' reservations, and Goliath's cursing and taunts, David has a word for Goliath. He said to the Philistine, "You come to me with a sword and with a spear and with a javelin, but I come to you in the name of the Lord of hosts, the God of the armies of Israel, whom you have defied. This day the Lord will deliver you into my hand, and I will strike you down and cut off your head. And I will give the dead bodies of the host of the Philistines this day to the birds of the air and to the wild beasts of the earth, that all the earth may know that there is a God in Israel, and that all this assembly may know that the Lord saves not with sword and spear. For the battle is the Lord's, and he will give you into our hand."

In a dramatic act of valor, as Goliath arose and came and drew near to meet David, David ran quickly toward the battle line to meet the Philistine. And David put his hand in his bag and took out a stone and slung it and struck



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the Philistine on his forehead. The stone sank into his forehead, and he fell on his face to the ground.

Little rejected David, who refused to be intimidated or bullied or ignored, whom nobody believed was capable of winning, this unlikely hero prevailed over the Philistine with a sling and with a stone, and struck the Philistine and killed him. And the Bible provides final commentary: "There was no sword in the hand of David."

This great story of courage and valor has real implications for us today as we seek the transformation, revival, and healing of the cities of America and the world.

- 1. God's enemies of the city, at least as they appear on the surface, are intimidating and formidable, and appear impossible to defeat (even to those who should know better!).
- 2. Lying intimidation is the foremost weapon of the enemy on those who face the challenge of engaging the enemy in the city.
- 3. God's best champions may seem the most unlikely people to overcome in his name: often they are overlooked, put down, and must fight their way into the fight.
- 4. God's weapons of warfare are effective: they operate on an entirely different plane in sync with different paradigms, principles, and perspectives.
- 5. No enemy can withstand the aggressive warfare of God's anointed representative.



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6. The entire battle often turns on the confidence of a single warrior who is willing to stand in the face of impossible odds, friendly fire, and open opposition from God's enemy.

Dear friends, the enemy intends to weaken you at the knees, to intimidate and taunt you, to make you and your team seem small, useless, outgunned, and overmatched in your work. Perhaps you are worn out, sick, living in the shadow of bad prognosis, scary neighbors, failed ministries, and petty squabbles.

Maybe you are out of money, out of ideas, out of support, and truly don't know how you will go on. We pray during these seasons for God's intervention and resources. His strength is made perfect in weakness, and he has said that no weapon fashioned against us will stand. Even in the face of the Goliaths of our ministries and lives, we can trust that God will eventually win, for he is Lord, and the battle belongs to him alone. As David said, there is a God in Israel, and we know that the Lord saves not with sword and spear. The battle is the Lord's, and he will win the day.

Therefore, in this season after Pentecost, let us pray to the Lord of the harvest. He has won the victory, the dragon is defeated, and the battle has been won at the Cross. It matters not how things have been going, what your bank account reads, or how many people you have with you. God is able to do exceeding abundantly above all that we ask or think by the power that is at work within us.

Remember, of all the things that the devil does (and does well) it is undoubtedly his ability to intimidate, to make us seem small, to make victory over evil an impossible dream. Those who walk by faith will always win the day.



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In God, we shall do valiantly, and nothing the enemy says can stop that. Let God arise, and may his enemies be scattered, in order that thousands of men and women, boys and girls, may enter into the Kingdom of God in the cities where you live. Prophesy deliverance, stand still, and see what God can do as we wait for God to arise!



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Global Strategic Vision

Pray fervently and in faith for the following *Gateway Cities in the 10/40 Window*. Ask the Lord of the harvest for laborers, increased vision, and manifestations of the Holy Spirit's revelation and power.

- Northern Africa: Bamako
- Middle East: Tel Aviv
- Central Asia: Almaty and Karachi
- Eastern Asia: Chengdu, and Xian, Tianjin and Hohhot

Pray fervently for these great cities, for spiritual wisdom and revelation for their populations, for insight into the truth of Jesus, that the Holy Spirit might illumine them, that the Gospel of Christ might take hold in the communities of these great cities, that churches may be planted, and that authentic missions might be spawned throughout each of these societies of influential Gateway cities. Let us entreat the Lord on behalf of these key cities, believing God for his intervention:

- Pray for Northern Africa and for the great city of *Bamako*. Pray for workers to evangelize the city and its suburbs, especially the Bambara people around Bamako. Pray that those involved in corruption and thievery would be overcome by the Gospel of Christ. Pray also that the audience of Christian programming on radio and television will expand and bear much fruit, and the literature ministry would flourish.
- Pray for an outpouring of God's Holy Spirit within *Tel Aviv*, this great Middle Eastern city. Pray for peace and unity among the local leadership and between the Arab and Jewish believers, and that the God of peace would reveal himself in the midst of the ongoing struggles there. Pray for strategic outreach centers to be established in the heart of this city and for teachers and evangelists–pray for



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boldness for all the believers, and for the youth searching for spiritual reality to find Jesus. Pray against judgment and criticism within the body of Christ, and that those involved in drugs, hedonism and immorality would see its full futility and turn to Christ.

- Pray for Almaty and Karachi, powerful Central Asian cities. Pray for Almaty, that the communist forces of atheism would be completely eliminated, and pray that this ideological vacuum will not be filled with Islam or some other cult. Pray that the Gospel of Jesus would not be restricted and that Almaty would be a hub where visiting Kazakh leaders, students, and businessmen would find the Lord and then spread his light throughout Kazakhstan. Pray for the complete translation of the Bible into Kazakh. Pray also for this nation as it moves its capital - hopefully keeping it from civil war. In Karachi, pray that the church would be healed of divisions and delivered of Hindu superstitions and occultic practices. Pray for the strengthening of the pastors and that the few Pushtu speaking believers would boldly declare the gospel to the 2 million Pukhtun people in the city. Pray for the evangelization of the Mahajirs, Ismaili Muslims, Afghan refugees, and the salvation of 1 million Balochs in the city. Pray also for effective ministry to the 1 million drug addicts in the city, and that the inter-ethnic conflicts, kidnappings, and violent crimes will cause people to look to Jesus for answers.
- Pray for *Chengdu* and *Xian*, *Tianjin* and *Hohhot* in Eastern Asia. Pray for the safety of the small fellowships in *Chengdu* and that they would be strengthened and multiply. Pray for the missionaries and tentmakers as they battle loneliness, depression and frustration. Pray for a release from demonic oppression. Pray for an effective witness to Chengdu's migrant workers and the students interested in books about Christianity. Pray that the Christians will be unified in their presentation of the Gospel.



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- Pray for God's blessing on the unofficial house churches in and around *Xian* which are training hundreds of evangelists and leaders. Pray that the pioneer church planting efforts of these evangelists throughout central China would be successful. Pray that the city's Muslim quarter might be reached with the Gospel and that TSPM members would know Christ as Savior and the Bible as God's Word, and that the true Prince of Peace would be known.
- Pray that the believers in *Tianjin* would grow in boldness and faith, and that believers holding political positions would have wisdom and an effective witness. Pray that evangelization resources and workers would be called to Tianjin, and the city might become a gateway to the Kingdom of heaven in that region. Pray that the response to Christian radio broadcasts and the Jesus film would greatly increase and that Christian literature would become more accessible. Finally pray that disillusionment with communism and ancient practices would be replaced with hope in Jesus.
- Pray for the Gospel to be planted and bear fruit in *Hohhot* among the Mongols, and that their nationalistic aspirations might be realized in the coming of the Kingdom of God to their people. Pray for the production of a Mongolian-script New Testament and that radio ministry directed to the Mongols might have an increased harvest. Pray for increased understanding of God's Word among illiterate Han Chinese believers and for teachers to help raise the literacy level of the residents.



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National Strategic Window

Intercede on behalf of eight of the inner cities of America, (*Baton Rouge, LA; Jersey City, NJ; Visalia-Tulare-Porterville, CA; Knoxville, TN; Stockton-Lodi, CA; Youngstown-Warren, OH; Syracuse, NY; Albany-Schenectady-Troy, NY; Jackson, MS*) that the Christian communities within these cities might rediscover the risen Christ in such a way that revival would occur in them, and the regions around them. Pray that the Holy Spirit might ignite fresh movements of vital spirituality and missions outreach in the churches present within these cities, and that the Lord would initiate new thrusts of laborers among the unreached in them.

- Pray that *the risen Christ would be recognized and worshiped in the communities called by his name in these cities*, and that they would *renounce worldliness and pettiness* in order to seek first God's Kingdom and his righteousness.
- Pray for *revival among God's people who live in these cities*, that they would *renounce all fleshly power and glory*, that pastors and Christians within them will rediscover the filling and power of the Holy Spirit, and that they will blossom with a new passion to win the lost around them and feel the burden of being custodians of God's true Word.
- Above all this month, pray for *an outpouring and visitation of the Holy Spirit that will result in thousands of new decisions for Christ, and the establishment of new Christ-centered, Bible-based churches in these cities.* Pray that God would grant the churches in these cities deep grace to see what is at stake in the telling of the Good News, and that all believers in them would sense the need to share the powerful riches of the truth of God within their particular circles of influence. Pray for a new awareness of God's mandate to make disciples in these cities, and for fresh, vigorous efforts to plant churches among the poor in these cities.

City Significance/History: Kazakhs take pride in Almaty, the capital city of Kazakhstan, known for its beautiful setting against the Tien Shan mountains. The Silk Road passed through the area, bringing the Mongol hordes from the north, who left their Mongol features and the Muslim religion.

Today Almaty is the governmental, business, and educational center of the country. However, to prevent the disintegration of the country, the Parliament has voted to move the capital from Almaty to the northern city of Akmola by the year 2000. The fall of Communism toppled both religious and political structures, forcing Kazakhs into an ideological vacuum. Having always been told what to do and believe, Kazakhs now have freedom to choose. Islam attracts some because it provides clear directives on life and supports Kazakh heritage. Other religions and cults are clamoring for allegiance, while secular materialism is successfully winning many hearts. Furthermore, Communism remains a threat-a chameleon which has changed its colors to blend in and survive.

Kazakhs are at an historical watershed. They desire to believe in something after so many years of Communism.

City Significance/History: The 70 kilometers between Jerusalem and Tel Aviv are as different as night and day. The mountains surrounding ancient Jerusalem give way to the Mediterranean coastal plains upon which the modern city of Tel Aviv was built

In 1909 some 60 Jewish families sought to create a Hebrew city of their own. Just north of Jaffa (Joppa) they bought land and created Tel Aviv. This new city attracted Jewish immigrants from Europe.

Jaffa is where Jonah caught a ship to Tarshish, and Peter had his vision regarding the spiritual "cleanness" of the Gentlies. Through this ancient port, now engulfed in the rapid expansion of metropolitan Tel Aviv, passed the timbers used for building the temple.

For a brief time, the city was the capital of the new Israeli state and the lifeline for the Jews in Jerusalem during the war of Independence in 1948. Tel Aviv has become the main center for commerce and business in Israel, and its international airport is the gateway to the country.

City Significance/History:

The winter was cold as wind blew a fresh layer of snow against the north side of the yurt (a nomadic tent home). To avoid the cold, horses were tied on the south side of the small circular home. The goats' milk was still warm inside. Ogadai remembered the summer when the grasslands provided plenty of food. Now the northern wind blows and almost everything is iced up. Tomorrow he will leave his family and trek the day's journey to Hohhot. He heard a Tibetan Buddhist monk was in town, and he wants to offer a goat to the sun god.

India

Gods are everywhere-in the rivers, stars, sun, and moon. Nature offered infinite gods to worship and revere. But in Hohhot, Mongol priests know how to make an offering acceptable to the different gods. The Buddhist monk also might be able to offer spiritual insight. In Hohhot, Ogadai can also trade skins for salt and other goods

Such was the life of a nomadic Mongol herdsman a thousand years ago. Hohhot started as a trading post and a place of temples. As China and the former USSR fought over Mongolia, Inner Mongolia became part of China, with Hohhot being the administrative and educational center. Mongols are a minority people in their own homeland.

Praver Points

1. Pray for the gospel to be planted and bear fruit among the historically resistant Mongols. Pray for the production of a Mongolian-script New Testament.

2. Pray that radio ministry directed to the Mongols might have an increased harvest.

3. Pray that the nationalistic aspirations of the Mongols might be realized in the coming of the kingdom of God to their people

Illiteracy has been an obstacle to the Han Chinese Christians growing in their faith. Pray for increased understanding of God's Word among these believers.

City Significance/History: Until the mid-19th century, Karachi was only a small fishing village and fort wedged between the Arabian Sea and the expanse of desert to the north. At the time, the British were gaining interest in the area. They built a naval base and moved the territorial capital from Hyderabad to Karachi.

Railways connecting it with the north were built, the port expanded, roads were paved, and Karachi became a place of migration for the first time. The population grew quickly. As the capital and commercial center, many people relocated to the area after massive irrigation projects turned the hot dry desert into farm land.

In 1963, the capital of Pakistan was moved to the planned city of Islamabad. Karachi, the main port city for the country, continued to be the commercial center. Islamabad is conservative, with many women in veils and traditional black garb. Karachi, in contrast, has Western dress and is more liberal.

Water supply in the desert is always a problem. The water system in Karachi has become insufficient for the expanding population

Karachi's most impressive monument is the tomb of Muhammad Ali Jinnah, the man who led the country to independence and served as the first governor general.

Prayer Points
1. Pray for effective ministry to the 1 million drug addicts in the city.

2. Pray for evangelization of the Mohajirs, Ismaili Muslims, and Afghan refugees.

3. Pray for for salvation of 1 million Balochs in the city; there are only 10 known Baloch believers in the world.

4. Pray that inter-ethnic conflicts, kidnappings, and violent crimes in the city will cause people to look to Jesus for answers

5. Pray that the few Pushtu-speaking believers can boldly declare the gospel to the 2 million Pukhtun people in the city.

6. Pray that the church would be healed of divisions and delivered of Hindu superstitions and occultic practices, and that pastors would be strengthened.





Chengdu (chung-doo) Day 25

Status of the church: TSPM 55,000 members, 2 churches (see Jinan for TSPM explanation)

Major Religious Sites: Baoguan Monastery, Wenshu Monastery Marquis Wu Temple, Qingyang Gong Temple (Taoist)

City Significance/History: Jade and pearls are not the real riches of China-rice, wheat, soybeans, and silk bring the most wealth. Chengdu is the capital of the most populous province, Sichuan, which produces more rice and other grains than any other province. The fertile soil allows for agriculture to play a major role in its livelihood and, of course, silk brought in further wealth.

Du Fu, a bright student, studies to take his college entrance exam. If he makes it into university, he will have a secure future. One of his friends failed the test, not so much because of lack of knowledge, but because of the extreme pressure that rides on this one test.

Du Fu leaves his parent's apartment on the third floor and walks down the poorly lit stairs. Mounting his bike, he heads for Wenshu Monastery. Wenshu is the god of wisdom, and it would be foolish not to offer incense before him. Fighting with other bikes for the right of way, Du Fu makes the left turn leading to Wenshu. He passes the fortune-teller, stopping only briefly to buy incense, then parks his bike.

Finally, before the statue of Buddha that came from Tibet at some earlier date, he lights three sticks of incense and bows gracefully at the waist. The exam grips his mind as he petitions for wisdom.

1. Many mission agencies are represented here, and each agency has its own view on sharing the gospel. Pray for unity and cooperation between Christians.

2. Pray for the safety of house church believers who face substantial repression from the Religious Affairs Bureau, the TSPM, and police.

3. Pray for an effective witness to Chengdu's "floating population" of migrant laborers from the surrounding villages

4. Pray for openness among the students interested in books about Christianity.

5. The Marquis Wu Temple holds the history of three gods with one still influencing most Chinese today. Pray that this influence binding the people would be broken.

City Significance/History: Today cities like Beijing and Shanghai are well known to most people. Three thousand years ago Xian was the Rome of the East. Traders came along the Silk Road from Rome, Persia, or Central Asia to do business in this great city. Merchants, artists, and soldiers walked the streets. Priests and emperors were honored and worshiped. The city was the capital for 13 ancient dynasties; as one would fall another would rise. The Silk Road also facilitated the eastward expansion of Buddhism into China.

India

In the 8th century, 2 million people might have lived in the metro area of Xian. But weakness in the Tang Dynasty permitted Turkish and Tibetan invaders to break up the taxation and wealth base of the dynasty. China was split into independent political states once again. The city declined quickly and never rose to be the national capital again.

The communist government, in its effort to decentralize industry from the eastern mega-cities, has developed Xian into an industrial center. This has resulted in tremendous population growth in the last 50 years, passing its growth in the 8th century. The government has also constructed many grey buildings, turned temples into factories or stores, and greatly improved the railways and roads

Prayer Points

1. The Nestorian Tablet, the record of Christianity's introduction to China in the 7th century, is housed at the provincial museum. Pray that this stone would speak prophetically to the people regarding their Christian heritage.

2. Pray that in this city of peace the true Prince of Peace might be known

3. Pray for God's blessing on the unofficial house churches in and around Xian which are training hundreds of

Musa tells his brother that last year he was able to sell the majority of what they had grown. He had learned from a Brazilian Christian man about new seeds that produce a greater harvest. City Significance/History: Dating back to the 3rd century bc, when China's history was known as the Warring States period, Tianjin has had a millitant reputation. Many saw this fortified city as strategic because it was ideal as a trade port and the main link with Beijing, France, Britain, Belgium, Germany, Russia, Japan, Italy, and the USA ruled Tianjin because of their interest in Far East trade. For periods, some of these countries had a significant military and the transmission of the state and the state and the state of the sta diplomatic presence in the city at the same time.

Missionaries, who arrived with the business community, saw the city as an open place to minister

The foreign invaders all left their mark on the city. Different buildings have French, German, or Italian features. Japan, during World War II, helped the city move forward as an industrial giant.

The Hai River allowed for ships to travel to the city, but heavy silting moved the main port downstream. The Japanese started dredging and expanding the port with the work finally being finished by the Communists. Now Tianjin handles a great number of goods, making it one of the busiest areas in China. It is the country's third largest city and busiest shopping center, with Commercial Street servicing almost 700,000 shoppers daily.


Prayer Points 1. Pray that the Christians will grow in boldness and faith, and that believers holding political positions would have wisdom and an effective witness.
